In Memory of Audie Mansfield

Audie Mansfield, was a long time member of LEG, who had dedicated a big part of her life to horses. She had a very long association with horses having shown and bred Arabian horses for years, and was well known around the show ring circles, along with her farrier husband Ron, who also showed Arabians in harness, and for a time ran a business transporting brides to their weddings by horse and carriage.

Audie loved all animals and at her home at Spring Creek fed the lorikeets each day when they came down to their lovely garden to feed and play on the paraphernalia that was set up for them amongst the trees and shrubs. She bred bantam chooks and Bourke's parrots, and had 4 dogs, a Rhodesian ridgeback, two Shih Tzus and a Foxie.

Audie also loved swimming and for many years taught swimming in various locations.

She was a regular competitor at LEG days with her Arabian horse Coolmunda Olympic (Ollie) and was also a Dressage Judge and often helped out in that capacity at Dressage Days.

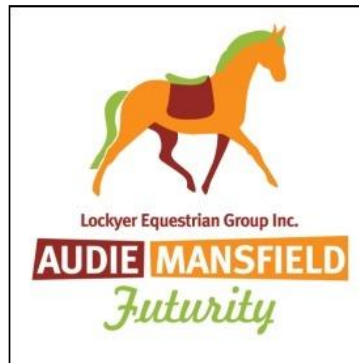

if competed Preliminary and Novice – class to be entered must be Novice,

if competed Novice and Elementary - class to be entered must be Elementary, and so on.

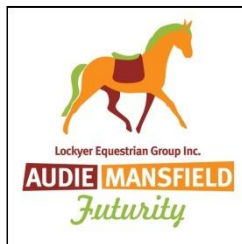

Conditions of Entry:

Competitors are advised to be aware of the Rules. The onus is on the rider to know the rules under which they compete.

The EA Dressage Rules and Dressage Tests may be downloaded from the EA web site: www.equestrian.org.au

1. This event will be conducted under current EA rules (www.equestrian.org.au)
2. Other acceptable conditions for Members Only Competitions (acceptable clothing/saddlery) are available from the website: www.legs.org.au
3. Horse/Pony & Rider Combination may enter **one level only**
4. Horse/Pony **minimum age** requirements – must be 3 years of age as at date of event
5. **One rider** per horse/pony for all rounds. Change of rider or horse will be allowed up to 8am 10th July 2016.
6. **Maximum of 2 horses/ponies per rider (on a balloted basis). Nominated second horse in same class will only be accepted if space allows.**
7. Timed draw for each round will be emailed and made available on the LEG web site and Facebook Page.
8. The committee reserves the right to restrict class sizes if necessary. **Classes will be limited to 35 entries** based on a “first in basis” as per the date entries received. A reserve list will be maintained for each class.
9. EA now have a no smoking policy. This policy does not allow smoking in the area in the arena, including gear check and in or around canteen areas
10. Please present to Gear Check at least 10 minutes prior to your draw time. You must be checked in at Gear Check before entering the indoor or outdoor competition areas.
11. When you have completed your test please present to Gear check upon leaving the competition area.
12. Please be prepared to ride early in the event of scratchings.
13. Any scratchings from the respective draw of the Audie Mansfield Futurity must be received as soon as possible so those on the reserve list can be notified. Contact Wendy Palmer on 0413331627 or email events@legs.org.au
14. Refunds of entry fees will be given after close of entries on vet/medical certificate being produced within 7 days of the said competition
15. In the event of cancellation due to weather or similar circumstances beyond our control a new date may be set. In the case of cancellation, \$2 may be retained per rider by the club.
16. Horse Health Declaration to be accepted together with release and waiver indemnity when entering through www.nominate.com.au. Please refer to Biosecurity Guidelines Below – remember **DO NOT TAKE SICK HORSES TO AN EVENT**. By accepting this declaration you declare that the horse/s on this entry will only be brought to the event if they are in good health. You will be giving your authorisation for the designated OC Steward to call for veterinary inspection of the horse/s on this entry and in your care should they be showing signs of illness at any time during the course of the event. You also agree to pay any veterinary fees incurred as a result of this.
17. Members may bring horses that are not entered for the event only if a Visiting Horse Form and Horse Health Declaration is completed and handed into office upon arrival. Both forms can be downloaded from www.legs.org.au

18. No pedestrians on the grassed area (unless calling)
19. No uncovered footwear in competition areas (ie main ring, warm up areas, gear check)
20. Any horses standing around waiting, should do so on the track, not accumulate around arena entrances and in the warm up area.
21. Designated lunging area – grassed area below tennis courts. No lunging in competition/warm up area
22. Bridle numbers must be displayed on both sides of either bridle or saddlecloth before going through gear check. If you have been allocated a new number and don't already have your own set a printed set will be available for collection at the office. No bridle number – no ride.
23. Stallions must be stabled and not tied to trucks or floats. All stallions must wear green discs or green bridle numbers – as per EA stallion guidelines. For further information please refer to www.equestrian.org.au
24. Please adhere to the "KEEP OF THE GRASS" signs situated in front of stable block and on showground side of the indoor arena.
25. Top 10 placings for Classes 1,2 & 3 and Top 5 places for classes 4,5 & 6 will be awarded on a points system. In each round points will be awarded for placings ie. if 20 starters in class 1st awarded 20 points, 2nd awarded 19 points and so on until last place horse is awarded with 1 point. In the event of a tie in any round the higher total of the 4 collective marks for that test will decide the better placing. If the collective marks are tied the total points for tied placings will be split. In the event of a tie in the Top 10 placings upon completion of round 2 the winners will be decided as per EFA Dressage Rules 1st July 2016 3.19.
26. As an insurance requirement please ensure that your helmet has a current expiry date, as they are now only stamped for a five year period.
27. Riders must attend presentation to collect prizes or may be forfeited at committee's discretion.
28. If you are unable to stay for presentation your tests can be posted to you at cost of \$3. Call to office and complete an envelope with Name & Address plus tests to be sent. Prizes/Rosettes/Ribbons will not be posted.

GENERAL EVENT INFORMATION.

DRESS CODE:

Formal attire ONLY - riding coat with shirt and tie/stock. No t-shirts. Horses preferably to be plaited.

If you would like to become a member to ride at this event you can download membership form and Indemnity from www.legs.org.au payment maybe made via EFT. Forms and copy of EFT receipt to be emailed to membership@legs.org.au or posted to LEGs P O Box 49 MARBURG 4346. Must be received by Membership Secretary before closing date of entries.

Dogs: Dogs on the ground are not the preferred option. If present they must be on a leash and under complete control at all times. They are not allowed in the canteen or competition areas (including the showground and grandstand) if owners or riders have dogs in these areas you will be asked to leave the area and may entail **elimination**.

Camping and Accommodation: \$15/night both powered and unpowered sites are available. These are not allocated and are on a first in basis.

Stabling: Available at cost of \$20 per day for LEGs members on our members days. Stables must be very well cleaned (including removal of feed stuffs, manure and wet patches) prior to leaving otherwise rider will be charged a \$50 cleaning fee charged by the Gatton Indoor Centre Management (this is not a LEGs fee). For larger events a \$50 bond is normally charged however this has been waived for our members days. No temporary overnight yards of any kind will be allowed.

Neither the Organising Committee of any competition to which these rules apply nor EA accepts any liability for any accident, damage, injury or illness to horses, owners, riders, grounds, spectators, or any other person or property whatsoever

Biosecurity Recommendations for Competitors

Primary responsibility for biosecurity at horse events lies with the horse owners and competitors long before the event takes place.

Practise good biosecurity

- Practise good hygiene and decontaminate equipment thoroughly.
- Do not share equipment, including food and water containers, between horses.
- Avoid use of communal water troughs.
- If using communal hoses, avoid touching buckets when filling with water to avoid spreading disease from bucket to bucket.

Monitor horse health

- **Do not take sick horses to an event.**
- Notify an event official if a horse is suspected of being sick.
- Isolate the sick horse and seek veterinary advice.
- Isolate any equipment that has been in contact with the sick horse.
